Measles Cases Confirmed in Oakland County

Measles cases have been confirmed in Oakland County. Patients have traveled throughout Oakland County, so we need to be prepared for potential measles exposure. <u>Utilize the appropriate PPE</u> when called to a potential measles patient.

Symptoms of measles usually begin 7-14 days after exposure, but can appear up to 21 days after exposure and may include, fever, rash, cough, runny nose, and red watery eyes.

All potential measles patients MUST be reported to the hospital PRIOR to arrival.
