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## **Medication Under Direct Medical Control**

The following medications are designated for use **ONLY** under direct medical control.

### **Cefazolin**

### **Ceftriaxone**

To use the medication the paramedic must:

1. Request direct medical control to use the medication.
  - a. If there is communications failure the medication cannot be used.
2. Describe to the medical control physician the rationale for use of the medication.
3. Advise the physician that there is no treatment protocol in the OCMCA that allows the use of this medication.
4. Advise the physician that they have been trained on the use of the medication.
5. Report the usage of the medication to their agency administration within 1 hour of its use.
6. The agency must notify the OCMCA within 72 hours of the medications use.
7. The agency must provide the incident ePCR along with proof that the paramedic has been trained to use this medication.
  - a. Any use of the medication by untrained paramedic may lead to disciplinary action.
8. The OCMCA PSRO shall review all administration of medications in this protocol.
